SHOW FEES: - EARLY ENTRIES ARE RECOMMENDED

\$10 office fee per horse

All Regular Class Entries \$10 per class per horse
NOTE: THIS IS AN OUTDOOR SHOW WITH NO STALL FACILITIES. CONCESSIONS WILL BE AVAILABLE. Negative Coggins Required. All horses on show grounds may be inspected at the discretion of show management.

NOTE: **Maximum Shoe Size "Liteshod"** (3/8" by 3/4") or keg, barefoot horses allowed. **No "Plantation" Shoes allowed.** No pads, bands, action devices. No trailers on shoes to exceed 1/2" in length - NO trailers on keg shoes. Bits - no shanks over 8 1/2". IJA rules apply (see below). In Versatility Classes, the TWHBEA Versatility Rulebook will prevail.

- NOVICE (rider): No more than 3 blues for RIDER in rail career (gaited only)
- YOUTH - 17 and under
- *Stallions 2 y.o. and over MUST be shown in a bridle BY AN ADULT. Bridle or halter optional for other adult horses.
- 2 y.o. horses may not show in back-to-back classes and may not be shown in more than 3 classes per day
- The GWHA abides by the USDA's HPA.
- All OGB classes are open to any gaited horse
- MH = Mountain Horse (all varieties)
- The use of hoof bands, tape on hooves, action devices, or use of any type of plastic wrap on the leg of a horse at any time on the show grounds will disqualify that horse from exhibiting at this show.
- *Barrels and Poles*: Cavessons, whips, crops, and bats are prohibited. **Helmet Required.**
- *Proper Tack* must be utilized, English or Western but not mixed. **Clothing and tack may be casual**, but appropriate for the discipline.
- Show management reserves the right to dismiss any participant or spectator from the grounds who exhibits bad sportsmanship or neglects or abuses their horse(s)
- ** OGB In-hand Trail Obstacle ** (not to have shown under saddle yet or any class during this show)

Additional GWAH Show Rules – NOTE: GWAH rules will take precedence over all other rulebooks

1. The GWAH promotes natural pleasure horses. Any lame, sore or horses with a crampy way of going will be excused.
2. No action devices or plastic wrap allowed on the show grounds and hoof bands will not be permitted in the show-ring.
3. Pads and action devices are not permitted on any horses exhibiting at GWAH shows including weanlings, yearlings, model, pleasure riding classes or exhibition.
4. The GWAH abides by the USDA's HPA. For further information on this act please refer to the following URL: <http://www.aphis.usda.gov/ad/hpact.html>
5. Missouri state law requires that equine participants carry proof of a valid Negative Coggins test and that "Health Papers" accompany all out-of-state horses.
6. The GWAH is not liable for any accidents, theft, death, or losses incurred as a result of participating in or being at GWAH shows or other activities.
7. Any horse deemed lame will be excused from it's class, and will not be allowed to exhibit further that day, unless the cause of lameness can be corrected and the horse is found to be sound.

CONDUCT

1. Person(s) disrupting the harmony of the show and/or classes will be banned from the show and grounds, forfeiting any entry fees already paid. Safety and ring etiquette is required in all classes. Repeat offenders will be dismissed.
2. Persons using profanity to the extent they cause disharmony on the show grounds can expect disciplinary actions to be taken by the show committee, punishment to be decided at that time using their discretion.
3. Cruelty to, or the abuse of, any horse by any person at a GWAH horse show is forbidden and renders the offender to penalty. The show committee must bar violators from further competition for the remainder of the show and he/she may jeopardize any participation in future GWAH activities. Violators will forfeit all entry fees, and will be reported to proper human organizations. The show committee reserves the right to decide upon the acts that constitute abuse.

SAFETY

1. Safety and ring etiquette is required in all classes. Repeat offenders will be dismissed.
2. All horses should stand quietly in the lineup and while being judged. If a horse is disruptive, the rider can be asked to remove it from the arena.

AFFILIATIONS

1. The GWAH will follow the Independent Judges Association Rulebook as the prevailing guideline.
2. Other guidelines will be rulebooks from the TWHBEA Versatility Handbook

INSPECTIONS

1. We reserve the right to hire and use qualified Veterinarians, DQPs, or Farriers to check for unsoundness.
2. All exhibitors are required to have their horses checked by the designated inspector before exhibiting.
3. All riders must be dismounted.
4. First place horses may be required to return for inspection immediately after class judging for an additional check.
5. Refusal to dismount and/or disrespect to the Veterinarian, Farrier, or Show Management or their designees will result in automatic class disqualification.
6. Spot inspection and show measurements may take place anywhere on the grounds throughout the show.
7. EXHIBITORS WHO ARE UNDER SUSPENSION FROM THE USDA OR ANY LICENSED DQP ORGANIZATION WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO SHOW.

HORSE SHOES

All shoe requirements will follow each breed association's rulebook except for the TWH, SSH – the shoeing regulations for such are on the show bill.

YOUTH CLASSES

Ages for youth classes are 17 and under unless otherwise specified. Youth are not allowed to show stallions in any classes.

DECLINING ENTRIES

The GWAH reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, and to cancel any entries or classes, disqualify/Exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel awards of prizes, without claim for damages.

JUDGES

1. All gaited breeds of horses shall be judged equally according to the standards of their breeds, disregarding any personal prejudices toward breed or color.
2. It is the responsibility of the judge to duly penalize violators of these rules and uphold the rules of the GWAH rulebook; therefore all judges decisions are final.
3. There will be no communication between the judge and ANY exhibitor except through a designated show committee representative for the day UNLESS the class is a designated as a schooling class.

TACK and ATTIRE

1. Proper tack is to be used in English and Western classes and not a combination of both.
2. The exhibitor and horse should have a neat, clean, and well-groomed appearance.
3. Management may bar any person from competing if not suitable dressed to appear before an audience.
4. Any exhibitor with a horse, whose breed requires a variation of the suggested attire, should dress according to their individual breed specifications.
5. The judge may excuse coats when temperatures dictate.

REPLACING SHOES

In the event of a horse throwing a shoe while being exhibited, the exhibitor can either continue in the class or ask to be excused. No shoeing replacement is allowed.

ENTRIES

1. Any exhibitor not promptly at the gate for the start of his/her class may be disqualified from that class, except in the event of tack changes.
2. Any exhibitor needing tack changes between classes are to notify the entry booth at the time of sign-up. There will be up to a three-minute delay for tack changes if the exhibitor is in two consecutive classes.
3. Once the gate has been closed, the class is considered to be complete. The gate will remain closed until the class has been judged.
4. Entry fees will be refunded only in the case of an injury to, or illness of, horse or rider.
5. Exhibitors are requested to give all the information called for on the entry blank forms.
6. Every exhibitor must make his own choice as to the class in which he will enter his horse, and abide by it; and great care must be taken to enter each horse in its proper class and division.
7. Exhibitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in making out entry blanks, but the Show Management, when in error, will make corrections to agree with the Exhibitor's original entry.
8. All protests are to be filed with the horse show management. Ringside disputes will not be tolerated.
9. Judges, Veterinarians, Inspector, Farrier, and/or DQP decisions are final and are not subject to protest.
